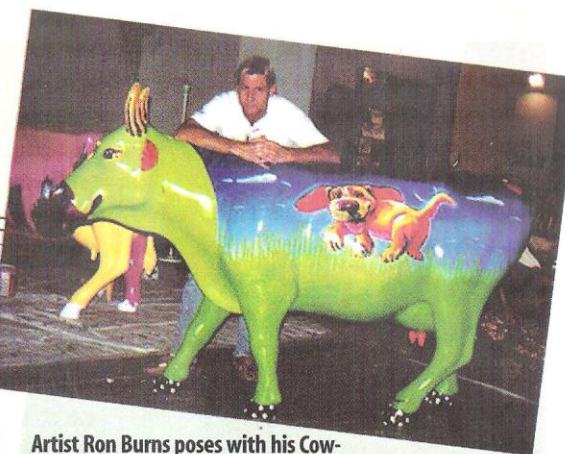
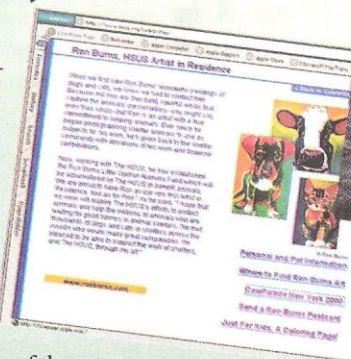




## Artist Ron Burns Featured on Humane Society Web site

National Farm Animals Awareness Week, to be held Sept. 17-23. Burns' cow will be one in a herd of more than 500 colorful life-sized cows decorated and painted by artists. The cow was on display on streets, parks and plazas throughout New York City over the summer.
